CAFÉ CHURCH - I am the Good Shepherd

Much fun was had at Café Church this month as we reflected on Jesus as the Good Shepherd.

When Jesus says, 'I am the Good Shepherd' he is recalling all that the people know about good shepherding in the Middle East described in Psalm 23: caring for their flock, leading them to still water they can drink easily and protecting them from predators. But Jesus goes on to relate this image to one of salvation when he says that he is the door to the sheepfold. Jesus cares for many sheep who know his voice and they are all one flock. He lays down his life for his sheep and takes it back up again — foreshadowing his death and



resurrection. Finally, this good shepherd is a leader. Our drama team portrayed an election for a leader comparing what each candidate had to offer the people.
