YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR PENSION CREDIT

The Winter Fuel Payment is an annual payment to help those who have reached State Pension age with heating costs during the colder months. The Government announced in July that, from this year onwards, to be eligible for Winter Fuel Payment you also have to receive a qualifying means-tested benefit such as Pension Credit. Dorset Council estimates that there are 5,400 residents in Dorset who are eligible for Pension Credit, but do not claim it, so will miss out on the Winter Fuel Payment when they could be receiving it. Applications for Pension Credit can be made on the 'How to Claim' page on GOV.UK or by calling 0800 991234 (Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm). The last possible date to make a successful backdated claim to receive the Winter Fuel Payment is 21st December.


